DROUGHT CONDITIONS INTENSIFY -- HELP CONSERVE OUR WATER!

Dear Customers:

As you are likely aware, drought conditions in our state and region are getting worse. These conditions are a very real threat to state and local water supplies. The Delhi County Water District believes that conserving water is the responsibility of every single one of us.

On July 8, 2021, Governor Newsom signed an Executive Order calling on all Californians to voluntarily reduce their water use by 15 percent compared to 2020 levels through simple actions such as reducing landscape irrigation, running dishwashers, and washing machines only when full, finding and fixing leaks, installing water-efficient showerheads and taking shorter showers. These voluntary efforts complement specific local conservation mandates already in place in some communities experiencing acute water shortage conditions this summer.

State officials estimate an additional 15 percent voluntary reduction by urban water users from 2020 levels could save as much as 850,000 acre-feet of water over the next year for future use, or enough to supply more than 1.7 million households for a year.
